And this does not just happen on January 1st, but every moment of every day.

In the month of January, we emerge from the story of Christ's birth to hear the journey of Jesus' early ministry. We first hear about Jesus' baptism and the start of his ministry: The calling of the disciples, the work of healing and miracles, the promises of his hope, peace, joy, and love fulfilled to our world.

Our annual meeting will be on *January 21st* after worship. We will have a movie day for Sunday School students so parents and teachers can attend the meeting. We look at the past year of our ministry with

thankfulness: 2023 was a year of transition, growth, tradition, as well as new beginnings, as we began our ministry together in August. As we look forward to a new year of ministry together, I ponder what kind of 'beginnings' does God have in store for our church? Where does God call us to see new life at work? Where do the waters of baptism lead us to serve our community and world? How can we reflect on our mission and live it out? All by the grace and the call of God.

May we embrace 2024 with faithful stewardship, discipleship, and hope in our God who loves us, who calls us, and who makes all things new, through Jesus Christ by the Holy Spirit.





St. James Church Council Meeting - December 13, 2023

Meeting was called to order at 5:35 p.m. by Council President Deb McWhirter. Present: Deb McWhirter, Aimee Deuell, Scott Bruns, Mystie Hummel, Dana Stewardship & Finance: Proposed budget discussed Uhlenhopp, Leslie Groen, Duane Folkerts, Jason along with treasurer's report. Shaull, John Heeren, Jim Davies, Jill Ford, Pastor Rebecca, and Financial Administrator Mindy Pecha. Worship & Music: No report. Meeting opened with devotions and prayer from Pastor Rebecca. The agenda was reviewed. Motion to Old Business: approve amended agenda made by Scott, seconded by Leslie. Motion carried.

REPORTS:

Treasurer's report was given by Mindy. November income was \$11,510.05 with expenses of \$13,005.69 Discussion regarding 2023 parsonage expenses which totaled approximately \$35,000. Stewardship and Finance Committee's 2024 budget proposal was discussed. A St. James Venmo account will be set up for New Business: easy, convenient giving. Parsonage decisions need to be made at some point as it has now sat empty for three years. Motion to approve reports made by Scott, seconded by Jason. Motion carried.

Secretary's report: November minutes reviewed. Mo- 6:30 p.m. tion to approve by Jim, seconded by Scott. Motion carried.

No formal report from Pastor Rebecca other than the positive update that St. James is doing very well overall.

Standing Committee Reports:

Education/Youth Ministry: The children's program was held December 10th, and the kids and teachers did a fantastic job. Pastor Rebecca has a Confirmation goal for Lent including a midweek service where the students can meet with a mentor following the service. There are 10 kids in the class so 10 mentors will be needed unless the students pair up to share a mentor. The meetings would last approximately 20-30 minutes.

Evangelism: The committee has been very busy with planning the James Aissen concert, Sunday School program and activities, and Wednesday night Food and Fellowship meals. Volunteers are needed for the

Wednesday meals. There will be no Food and Fellowship on December 27. Christmas caroling will be held on Friday, December 22.

Property: Written report from the committee was reviewed. Discussions continue regarding the church roof project. If anything is going to move forward, a minimum of one-third of the money needed for the roof will need to be raised before any work commences. The committee expects a second bid for the project will be forthcoming.

Nominating committee report. Three incoming council members have been established and the committee is working on the fourth.

Snow removal update. (Outlined in written Property Committee report).

Annual meeting will be held January 20, 2024, following worship service.
