Happy New Year! We continue this chilly month with our Advent, Christmas and Epiphany Theme: *From Generation to Generation*. This Epiphany we focus on how we can keep seeking... keep seeking ways to deepen our faith, grow our love for God's justice and grace, and pour out God's love to the world. As we move into the season of Epiphany, we are reminded of the journey of the magi. We are told in Matthew 2 that they came to pay him homage and brought 3 gifts, hence how we got the thought that there may have only been 3 magi. Guided by a star, they embarked on a long and uncertain journey to find the newborn King. Their search was not just for a ruler, but for hope, for truth, and for a deeper understanding of the Messiah and God's plan for all creation.

Every new year we enter an unfamiliar path, and an unpredictable journey begins. No matter how you embrace the new year, the magi can inspire each of us to listen for God's guidance, even when the path is unclear. Despite the hardships of their journey, the magi encourage us to keep moving forward in faith, trusting that God is with us each step along the way. Their gifts serve as a reminder of who we worship and foreshadows the life of Christ: The gold is symbolic of Jesus the King and God's Kingdom to come; The frankincense was used to honor God in worship, honoring Jesus as the Son of God; The myrrh was used as a spice to help embalm and anoint the dead, foreshadowing Christ's death for our sake and for the salvation of the world.

The magi's journey and gifts inspire us to think about the places we are called to follow God, offering him the best gifts we can- our worship and our hearts and love poured out for the world!

Where might God lead us this new year? In the midst of all of life's unknowns, what a beautiful gift of surrender to follow God's light and to trust that no matter where the journey leads us, God will be our guide. No matter how you embrace this new year and season, may you always remember God is with you and you are not alone.

Let us pray (this was one of my narrations in the Christmas with Wartburg program back in December): Surprising and astonishing God, open our hearts to the radiant hope found in the manger. Open our minds to the miraculous way the angels bring us your tidings of peace. Journey with us as we follow your marvelous light that guides us to your stable of grace. Amen.



Devotions given by Jim Davies and Pastor Rebecca. Motioned by Leslie, second by Danny to approve the agenda. All ayes. Motion carried.

REPORTS:

Treasurer's report was provided by Mindy Pecha. November income was \$17,105.96 with \$6,800 for the Raise the Roof campaign and total expenses of \$12,784.29. Motioned by Leslie, second by Jim to approve the Treasurer's report. All ayes. Motion carried.

Secretary's Report: November minutes were reviewed. Motioned by Pastor Rebecca, second by Jason to approve the Secretary's report. All ayes. Motion carried.

Standing Committee Reports:

Stewardship and Finance: Met on December 5th went through the 2024 budget and proposed a budget for

2025 to be presented at the annual meeting.

Property Committee: Mentioned the lattice around the 1 year term: Alyssa Endelman bell tower will need repair or replacement and Randy will work on quotes. The council discussed if smoke detectors and carbon monoxide detectors in the basement.

Education/Youth Ministry: The Children's Program will take place on December 15th with fellowship to follow and Luther League will lead the Christmas Eve Candlelight service.

Evangelism – They are hosting fellowship again following the Sunday School's Christmas program.

Worship & Music – They are planning and Lessons in Carols service for December 29th.

Nominating Committee - Scott Bruns shared the names of church members who agreed to be nominated for the six open Church Council positions in 2025 and those who agreed to be nominated for the Nominating Committee in 2025. The council thanked him and the Nominating Committee for the great job they did to fill the council in 2025.

Pastor's Report: Pastor will be officiating the Care Center worship on December 12th and attended the WELCA Advent program @ Elm Springs. Pastor also attended Robin Morton's piano recital and participated in Christmas at Wartburg again this year. Pastor shared the church potluck went well with approximately 40 participants and Pastor hopes it can be a tradition that continues to grow. In addition, she is participating in a Synod team of women and continued with visits and calls.
