

James Council Meeting Minutes November 13, 2024

Meeting was called to order at 5:30 p.m. by Jim Davies. Present: Danny Bohlen, Taylor Salge, Aimee Deuell, Leslie Groen, Jeremy Idler, Amanda Wehrhan, Financial Administrator Mindy Pecha and Pastor Rebecca Baird. Devotions given by Pastor Rebecca. Motioned by Jeremy, second by Talyor to approve the agenda with the addition to add a Communion kneeling discussion to New Business. All ayes. Motion carried.

#### **REPORTS:**

Treasurer's report was provided by Mindy prior to the meeting. October income was \$25,614.50 with \$13,400 for the Raise the Roof campaign and total expenses of \$11,922.76. Motioned by Leslie, second by Danny to approve the Treasurer's report. All ayes. Motion carried.

Secretary's Report: October minutes were reviewed. Motioned by Pastor Rebecca, second by Jim to approve the Secretary's report. All ayes. Motion carried.

Standing Committee Reports:

Stewardship and Finance: Nothing new to report.

Property Committee: Council reviewed the minutes from their November 3<sup>rd</sup> and Danny summarized the projects discussed.

Education/Youth Ministry: Nothing new to report

Evangelism – They are hosting fellowship again following the Sunday School's Christmas program.

Worship & Music – They are planning the Christ the King program for November 24<sup>th</sup> which will be fol-

lowed by Christmas decorating and the Church-giving potluck for all.

Pastor's Report: Pastor completed some visits and calls, officiated Don Henrichs funeral, and attended Region 5 Boundaries training. She is working on the church Advent devotional, Advent worship planning, and the Allison Care Center worship will resume this week. Pastor also shared a film she recently watched called "A Time for Burning" with the Synod Racial Justice Network, a group of rostered and lay leaders. She meets with them monthly.

Old Business: Leslie will contact Dana about scheduling a Steward & Finance Committee meeting for budgeting. Council discussed being available to help with Church-giving potluck and providing drinks.

New Business: Council met with a Cub Scout rep via Zoom to share information about St James being a charter for a new Allison pack. Pastor Rebecca shared with the Cub Scout rep that there is an active pack in Greene and our church and students are closely tied to Greene. Pastor thanked the Cub Scout rep for her time and presentation. Motioned by Danny, second by Aimee not to pursue chartering a Cub Scout pack over concerns of competing with an established pack in Greene. All ayes. Motion carried. Jim emailed the roof contractor and we are scheduled for spring 2025. Discussions were held regarding the nominating committee and process. Since the current Council only has 10 members, discussions were held regarding the need for 6 new council members total to get back to 12, which consists of four new three-year terms, a one-year term vacancy and a two-year term vacancy. Pastor Rebecca will review the constitution to be sure we are filing the positions correctly. Aimee shared that a new adult Bible study will begin in January and take place 2 Sundays per month. She will be hosting with Jim and Nancy Davies and it will center around the subject of parenting.
