
Thank you to those volunteers at LOL each Wednesday night. The kids are surrounded by wonderful mentors!

### FROM PASTOR NORM'S STUDY:

"The Fruit of Your Labor"

The Apostle Paul wrote, "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness. faithfulness, gentleness, self-control, against such there is no law." [Galatians 5:22]

MY BAD: Each year about the time—when the grass turns green and the flags are back in at the local golf course—I share with the congregation that I am serving how there is similarities between living our faith and playing the game of golf.

In their book <u>In His Grip</u>, authors Jim Sheard and Wally Armstrong write, "The fruit of something is defined by Webster's dictionary as 'the result, product, or consequence of any action.' What is the 'fruit' of our golf game? Not the fruit of any one round, but the fruit over time?"

"For most people the fruit of golf is lasting friendships, the benefits of exercise, the satisfaction of improved skills and an appreciation for the beauty of nature. For some there may also be negative consequences such as lost friends, wasted time, poorly spent or lost money, and time that could better spent with family or at work."

"If we invest ourselves in our golf game in the right way and with the right attitudes, there's little question that we will enjoy the positive fruits of the game. It will be a blessing to us and we will be a blessing to those around us."

"This passage in Galatians suggests that the fruit of the Holy Spirit at work within an individual, over time, will be an increased level and quality of love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, gentleness, and self-control."

"With the help of the Holy Spirit, this fruit is demonstrated in our life as we allow our Heavenly Father to work in us. It is not so much what we do but rather what we let the Spirit do in and through us. When we allow the Spirit of God to change us and put us to useful service, we will begin to see the fruit of our labor."

To: St. James Members:

At our recent Council Meeting which was held on May 9<sup>th</sup>, we reviewed our monthly and YTD financials (as we do each month). The Council made the decision to have a letter put in our monthly newsletter that gives a few more details as to where we are to date, and what some of our projects are for 2022.

YTD, we are very close to being at a "break even" as far as income and expenses go. Our giving are on budget and this is greatly appreciated by all. We had been running at a nice margin through 3 months of the year, but had a large expense of Building Insurance hit us in April, which got us back to break even. We continue to carry a strong balance on deposit which will cover any shortfalls for the year, but wanted everyone to be aware where we are through the first 4 months of 2022. Summer months are always a challenge for churches with attendance and this can also affect our giving. As most of you know, we do have the ability to set up automatic giving to St. James which is done monthly, and automatically comes out of your designated deposit account. Very simple to do, so if you have the desire to set this up, please contact the church office and Syd will direct you to the forms that are needed. (I personally have been doing this for several years and it gives me peace of mind that my giving are not affected if I'm unable to attend a church service)

We do have a couple of projects on the horizon, with one being kitchen remodeling of our Parsonage. We are hopeful to be able to fill our Call and get a full time pastor hired in the future and would like to get this remodeling done before that happens. Our Building Committee and Council went through the parsonage and all agreed that some updating is needed. Our Council is reviewing bids and may make a decision fairly soon. If you want more info on the amount, etc, please let us know so this can be shared with you. We may also discuss this at one of our upcoming church services. If you have the desire to fund part of this project, that would be greatly appreciated so give that some prayerful thought.

The other project will be to shingle our Church, which will be a considerable amount. Building committee has been getting bids on this also. More to come at a later date.

As mentioned, we just wanted to keep you informed on how we are doing financially and what may be upcoming over the next few months. If you have any questions, feel free to contact a Council member.

# St. James Church Council Minutes – May 9, 2022

President Deb McWhirter called the meeting to order at 6:32 p.m. Present: Deb McWhirter, Bonnie Dralle, Denny Wiegmann, Dana Uhlenhopp, Scott Bruns, Ted Koester, Jeremy Idler, John Heeren, Jill Ford, and Mindy Pecha, Treasurer. Meeting opened with devotions from Ted.

Agenda was reviewed. Motion to approve agenda from Scott, seconded by Bonnie. Motion carried.

#### **REPORTS:**

Pastor's written report was reviewed. Pastor Bauer feels that St. James would benefit from developing a group of lay leaders (Eucharistic Ministers) to serve communion to shut-ins. These individuals would be trained and equipped for this task. Currently there are 12-15 people receiving communion in their homes and approximately 17 more at the care center. More volunteers, both men and women, would be very beneficial. A sign-up sheet will be posted.

Motion by Dana, seconded by Scott to accept and approve pastor's accountable allowances submitted. Motion carried.

Treasurer's report: Monthly income, expenses, and insurance payments were reviewed. Motion to approve report by Bonnie, seconded by Jason. Motion carried.

Secretary's report: Motion to approve April minutes by Bonnie, seconded by Jeremy. Motion carried.

#### Standing Committee Reports:

Education: Vacation Bible School will be held July 11-14, 2022. Registration forms are available. Trinity Reformed Church is planning a second VBS shortly before school starts that will be held in the early evenings.

Evangelism: May baskets were delivered. Envelopes for Christmas Cheer donations are available on the bulletin board. Plans are being made for a Sunday service to be held at the Wilder Park Chapel with a brunch following. Golf carts will be available to take people from parking lot to the chapel.

Stewardship & finance: YTD giving is down. Reminder to continue giving during the busy summer months. Automatic pay is still available.
